Vincent L. Frakes joined the Center for Health Transformation in 2009 as Project Manager, National Policy. Vincent works closely with CHT members to analyze the impact of federal health legislation and regulation on the industry and to develop sound policy solutions that could help transform health and healthcare

Prior to joining the Center for Health Transformation, Vincent was a valued member of the Government Relations and Public Policy team at the DC Chamber of Commerce. He focused on legislation and policy analysis, specifically in the area of health care, affecting businesses operating in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area. Additionally, Vincent has helped direct government affairs efforts for a large pharmaceutical-sponsored prescription savings program benefitting the uninsured and underinsured. His work included organizing large meetings with numerous U.S. Senators, Congressmen and congressional staff. He also focused on examining health policy directives related to pharmaceutical manufacturers. On Capitol Hill, Vincent worked for the U.S. House Committee on Ways and Means, which included work on both the Subcommittee on Trade and with the full committee.

Vincent holds a Juris Doctorate from American University's Washington College of Law, where he published an article on investor's rights and arbitration mechanisms under NAFTA, and a Masters Degree in International Affairs from the School of International Service at American University.
